
Join the path of hundreds elephants in Tarangire,

Our **8 Day Highlight Safari** was designed for the traveler with an adventurous spirit, seeking an intimate experience in the local Hadzabe bushmen tribe, but also still taking advantage of enjoying a wildlife safari which includes visits to Tarangire National Park, Serengeti National Park, Lake Eyasi, and the famous Ngorongoro Crater which, features one of the highest concentrations of game in Africa.

Up to 2 million animals, such as wildebeest, zebra, gazelle, topi, hartebeest and impala, migrate seasonally, in a clockwise direction, from south Serengeti in Tanzania to the north.

This is the perfect trip to experience the best part of beautiful Tanzania, with a mix of wildlife, nature beauty and culture.

Day 1 Arrival and Transfer to Tarangire NP

You will drive to Tarangire, a "must see" for avid birdwatchers, boasting over 550 different bird species, the most diverse in Africa, including the Kori Bustard, the heaviest flying bird in the World! The Tarangire River runs through the park attracting a huge number of elephants, buffalo, giraffe and antelope, particularly in the dry season between June and October. It is not uncommon to see large herds of elephants roaming through Tarangire's savannah grasses or taking shade under the odd looking "upside down trees" (baobab) that are dotted around the park. Enjoy your night in Roika Tented Camp outside the park on the border to the entrance

Day 2 Tarangire- Karatu

After breakfast we depart for a game drive. The park runs along the line of the Tarangire River and is mainly made up of low-lying hills on the Great Rift Valley floor. Its natural vegetation mainly consists of Acacia woodland and giant African Baobab trees, with huge swamp areas in the south. Both the river and the swamps act like a magnet for wild animals, during Tanzania's dry season. The Tarangire National Park is reputed to contain some of the largest elephant herds in Africa. This African National Park is also home to three rare species of animals – the Greater Kudu, the Fringed-eared Oryx, as well as a few Ashy Starlings. After a picnic lunch we do an afternoon game drive. Then you will leave the Tarangire area and head towards the Great Rift Valley.

Overnight stay will be in Karatu at Bougainvillea Lodge.

Day 3


Hadzabe tribe, Lake Eyasi

This morning very early you will drive to Lake Eyasi Area where you will have the opportunity to walk with a Bushmen Tribe in the Village around the Lake Eyasi. The Bushman (also known as the Wahadzabe tribe) still maintain their traditional hunter-gatherer way of life.

Around the same area, you will find the Datoga. Watch them perform their blacksmith duties. Both tribes using the local methods applied it the Stone Age era. A visit to the village will be led by a local guide who will describe their lifestyle. The Bushman will make fire from sticks and will show you their very few belongings. They will take you on a simulated hunt in the area with their bows and arrows, and visitors can try a little target practice. The visit may be concluded with a traditional singing and dancing. After that you will pay the Datoga tribe a short visit to watch them doing their work and get a brief introduction to their lives. In the afternoon you will be drive to Karatu town for relaxing and your overnight stay.

Dinner and overnight stay will be at Bougainvillea Safari Lodge/Karatu Country Lodge.

Early in the morning you will drive to Ngorongoro Crater for a full day game drive inside the crater. Ngorongoro is a large volcanic caldera that is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and home to a huge variety of animals. As you descend into the crater there is the feeling of entering a truly special place. The landscape is a mixture of forest, lakes and wide open plains that make it a perfect place for animal watching. Among the animals you can see here are black rhinoceros, lion, cheetah, hyena, jackal, hippos and many others. After a game drive you will have a picnic lunch at a site on the floor of the crater.

Dinner and overnight stay will be at Ngorongoro Wildlife Lodge/Ngorongoro Rhino Lodge

Day 5 Serengeti Game Drive

After a nice breakfast we will drive you into the Part of the Serengeti National Park, trying to see where the migration takes place. This is always different depending on the time of the year. The Serengeti National Park is home to the migration of massive numbers of wildebeest and zebra as they move into Kenya's Masai Mara. The Serengeti is considered to be the best place in the world to see the magical lion up close. You will also see a great range of other wildlife. As we drive into the centre of the park we will stop for a picnic lunch.

Dinner and overnight stay will be at Serengeti Mara Kati Kati Tented Camp

Today you will leave early morning, game viewing on the way out of the Serengeti National Park.

Mto Wa Mbu is your next and last destination, a town located around the Lake Manyara Area.

Bustling with a variety of cultures from around Tanzania, the little town of Mto Wa Mbu lies at the entrance to Lake Manyara National Park. A local agricultural hub, the town is famous for its crops of rice and the distinctive red bananas that Tanzania is known for. We will take you around to experience the real Tanzanian life, have a local lunch and maybe even a short soccer game with some enthusiastic kids.
